


Our volunteer Board provides a forum for leaders to learn from one another, exchange new ideas and gain insights into the issues facing families in BC.

ABOUT THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Board of Directors is composed of no fewer than five and not more than twenty members from the following regions of the province:

Vancouver Coastal

Vancouver Island (nominations are encouraged)
Fraser (nominations are encouraged)
Northern (nominations are encouraged)
Interior (nominations are encouraged)

Board Job Description

Board members are the fiduciary for all decisions made on behalf of the Council. Those decisions focus on overall governance issues such as: strategic planning, fundraising and development, finance, legal matters, and Executive Director oversight. The Board meets quarterly. There is one meeting per year that takes place over two days, in conjunction with the Annual General Meeting that is an in-person meeting. The Board is an active group and many Board members serve on a working committee(s) such as: Finance or Human Resources. Other committees are more seasonal in nature such as: Nominations. Council has board insurance to assure that members are covered while serving in this capacity.

Criteria for Membership on the Board

- Willingness to serve on the Board and participate in committees
- Ability to contribute to the Board's deliberations while taking into account the needs of families in BC
- Willingness to outreach to other boards for the purpose of fulfilling the Council's strategies
- Ability to attend a maximum for four meetings a year (one in person in Vancouver), participate in sub-committee(s), and to be available via electronic media (telephone, e-mail, etc.)
- Previous board experience with governance is an asset
- Some specific skills that are sought: adult education, marketing, fundraising and development, finance and accounting, strategic planning and legal
- Candidates should have a passion for the quality of life for families in BC
- A commitment to the Council's Strategic Plan

The requirements for Directors are:

- Membership in the BC Gouncil for Families (see attached)
- A contribution to the Council (see attached)
- A commitment to attend Board meetings and participate in at least one committee
- A willingness to represent the Council on the local or regional level
- A willingness to bring strategic ideas to the Board

Terms

Each term is three consecutive years. Directors may serve for two consecutive three-year terms.

Expenses

Board members are reimbursed for reasonable expenses incurred to attend the in person AGM and Board meeting of the Council one time per year. No other expenses are reimbursed.

Board Nominations and Election

Members of the BC Council for Families who wish to stand for nomination to the Board must complete the attached nomination form and submit it to the Council offices to the attention of the Nominations Committee.

The Board Governance and Nominations Committee will review all nomination applications. Applicants selected will be interviewed by a member(s) of the Board Governance and Nomination Committee. Applicants will be selected based on the Board needs indicated in the criteria above. The applicants selected for the Board will be informed and invited to attend the Annual General Meeting of the Council to be followed by a Board meeting in July 2015.

The information you provide in the application will be used in the profile sent to members for the election. A picture of each candidate will need to be provided for the AGM program, the website and other purposes of the Council. Please be as specific as possible within the space provided.
